

Most of this article is about the American Legion Gift Shop which is a big deal at the VA Hospital. Every year the gift shop opens for three days in early December. This is where hospitalized veterans and lower income veterans can shop or fill out a list of their family members ages, sizes and needs. If they are unable to go shop, then their lists are filled by the elves who pick up those gifts which are also wrapped for them. I am lucky enough to go and see the shop every year. It is amazing.

Hundreds of gifts are spread out on tables and can be picked out for them. All of the Post's Auxiliary members provide money for this event by having dinners, bake sales and other events to provide this money. All of this is provided free to these veterans. All year these ladies shop sales and bargains to provide these gifts. This year, 506 veterans were able to shop for 906 family members. \$4,100.00 was spent on toys for children.

They also had blankets for service dogs of the vets. Many vets now need these dogs who perform amazing tasks for them. Many non auxiliary ladies crochet and sew quilts and throws for wheel chairs and beds in amazing patriotic colors and each veteran receives one for himself or herself.

This morning I got a call from the Chairman of the group who wanted me to thank everyone of you who donated the wrapping paper, bows, boxes and tags. Three times I received or came home and found boxes and sacks in my carport with all of these items. She was almost in tears when she told me that they did not have to buy one of those items. All of their gifts were purchased without having to buy anything extra.
