
He came to our office and talked to a Veteran Service Officer (VSO). He then became a volunteer at the VA. which is where I volunteer.

I gave the whole package to him. He had none. I gave him donations of shampoo, deodorant, a toothbrush, all of which you had donated from time to time.

A lady called who was cleaning out a guest house on her property. She wanted to give a veteran the furniture. I told her that we couldn't accept it, but that we were helping a homeless vet and right away she wanted to contact him. She held onto that furniture until he got housing and she and her husband and son delivered it to his apartment. Homeless housing has no furniture

To make a long story short, he has been hired by the VA, has a furnished apartment and is working every day. Not every story ends this happily, but this one did. I am happy that I was here to see it. It really is a true story.






