Some information from the quarterly meeting I attended at the VA hospital:

The new **VRC** (veteran resource center) has opened. They help veterans work through the system and help get them registered as well as any problems they encounter. The first week they have already assisted over **500 veterans**.

Two speakers from Recreation Therapy told how they help veterans in the Community Living Center (CLC). They are elderly and hospice veterans. They have many events planned, sports venues have donated many free passes, they have horse therapy, as well as dogs and cats come in to see them. There is also another program called "No Veteran dies alone" and they have volunteers sit with them. If you are interested, you can call to inquire.

Just a last minute note to let you know that we donated a total of **415 rolls** of wrapping paper plus all of the other items you included. **Thank you so much Pioneers and others. You are the greatest.**

PIONEERS HELP ARROYO SCHOOL ANTI-BULLYING PROGRAM

Last year Arroyo Elementary School, 4535 W. Cholla St., Phoenix, started an Anti-Bullying program in the upper grades. The program was so successful that this year it is mandatory for the entire school and is being reviewed for usage in the entire Washington School District.

Teachers at Arroyo have created a Character Counts Committee which is responsible for the program that instills a positive school climate and creates a "culture of kindness" while making a safe environment for students' education. The six basic values (also known as "Pillars of Character") are supported in every classroom: Trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and citizenship. It has been documented that using this program has dramatically decreased student violence and bullying.

The students showing good character have been rewarded with pizza lunches, prize bags, and schoolwide recognition. Arroyo Elementary School requested that **Phoenix Thunderbird Club** join in by donating four bicycles, with safety helmets and bicycle locks to be awarded. They want to create some excitement within the student body by providing a quarterly drawing for a bike for students that show exceptionally good character. Phoenix Thunderbird Club is stepping up to provide those prizes. We have provided support to Arroyo School in the past with donations of computers, bulletin boards, school supplies, teacher awards and prizes for student achievements.

PHOENIX THUNDERBIRD CLUB TEE BOX SPONSOR

In the continuing support of veterans and education at all levels, the Phoenix Thunderbird Club name was on the First Tee Box at the fifth annual S.E.E.4Vets Golf Tournament held at the Wigwam Resort, November 16, 2018.

S.E.E.4Vets (Support Education and Employment for Vets) is a local 501(c)(3) which focuses on tutor-structured math and English classes in community colleges for veterans transitioning from military to civilian life. As these classes are not GI Bill eligible, S.E.E.4Vets provides scholarships to attend these classes.

To put it mildly, military personnel serving in the Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts were not concentrating on college-level math and English skills! S.E.E.4Vets partners with community colleges throughout the state to assist veterans in getting their college sea legs. The \$100 Tee Box Sponsorship contributed to funding these educational opportunities for veterans.
