The store even opened early to accommodate all the volunteers, teachers and



students who attended. "Everyone involved had so much fun shopping and, at the end of the day, each child went home with two pairs of shoes and a bag of socks!" noted Cathy Greer, a Pioneer at the event. "Working together with the Lions Club, we accomplished so much more than we could on our own." In addition to hosting the shoe party, the chapter also works with the Lions to help provide vision screening to children across Tucson. Just last year, over 22,000 students in 65 schools were the beneficiaries of the strong partnership between the two organizations. Across the country, these Pioneers (and many other volunteers) were thrilled to be paid only in grateful smiles for making sure all these children found shoes that fit them just right.
