8 Bicycles + 8 Chromebooks = 16 Thrilled Students



At the school assembly May 20, 2019, Phoenix Thunderbird Club awarded 8 bicycles and 8 Chromebooks to students at Acacia Elementary School, 3021 W. Evans Drive, Phoenix, who have met certain reading achievements or math improvement goals. Seven Pioneers attended the presentation assembly. The programs are open to any and all Acacia students. Since this program was started by Phoenix

Thunderbird Club Pioneers in 2011, over <u>65 bicycles</u> and <u>numerous laptop computers</u> have been awarded to students. Each bicycle is presented with a bike safety helmet and bicycle lock. Each Chromebook was presented with a protective sleeve and a mouse.

Students read grade appropriate books throughout the school year and take a test about each book read. Students who pass the tests are awarded points. When a student receives X-number of points, their name is put in a drawing for the bicycles. Students are tested on math skills at the beginning and end of the school year and the students' names with the highest points of improvement are put in a drawing for the laptops. The Principal draws the winning names and the excited winners skip, run, and hop up to the stage, while the Pioneers clap and yell "Good job!".

Students with fewer points than the "leaders", but still with notable improvement, were also given awards varying from a bag of school supplies to a small robot, and each one also received a book to take home. 
