Joe Hersey, a longtime, dedicated Pioneer, passed away October 16, 2019. His volunteer activities are too numerous to list. Two outstanding volunteer undertakings come to mind when Joe is mentioned – "The Park" and "The Museum". He was a leader in the fundraising, design and building of Telephone Pioneers of America Park in Phoenix, AZ which broke ground January 23, 1983. Joe was instrumental in guiding and maintaining the Telephone Pioneers Museum, especially during its final move in 2016, to the Living Pioneer Museum. Hersey worked for the telephone industry for 35 years until he retired in 1988.

DONATE MONEY TO A SCHOOL - GET A TAX CREDIT

The AZ tax credit program gives a **dollar-for-dollar reduction** in state income taxes. This law allows taxpayers the opportunity to designate their tax dollars to directly benefit a specific school(s) and students. The maximum credit allowed is \$400 for married filing jointly and \$200 for single, head of household, or married filing separately.

According to the law, this money must be designated for extracurricular activities that supplement the educational program such as before- and after-school clubs; classes; sports programs; and non-recreational field trips. You don't need to know a child in school. You can ask the school to designate to which program your donation will go. Talk to your tax preparer for more details or go online azdor.gov/tax-credit. Deadline, as with most donations, is April 15, of the coming year.

Extracurricular programs provide positive learning experiences for children.

LABELS FOR EDUCATION® ENDED

Thank you to Pioneers who have saved Campbell soup labels for the *Labels for Education* ® program. Soup Labels will no longer be collected as the program has ended. For over 43 years, Campbell has offered the program which has contributed more than \$110 million in school supplies to tens of thousands of schools across the U. S. The program has recently been evaluated and it has been determined that, with participation considerably declining, the program is no longer strong. The program has wound down and has come to a close.
