VOLUNTEER AT SCHOOL HEARING AND VISION SCREENING

The Sensory Screening Program supports hearing and vision screening for children in the State of AZ. The state mandates require that a program for hearing and vision screening be held for children in an effort to identify any impairments. Hearing and vision screenings are generally initiated at the beginning of the school year and are held in compliance with AZ State Law and Department of Health Guidelines.

Vision and hearing impairments may get in the way of a child's ability to learn and may go unnoticed. It's important to be pro-active. Without a screening test, a problem may not be found until a child develops educational or even medical problems. With screenings, a child's previously unrecognized problems may be identified.

The screenings are done with State approved screening equipment with current calibration, by Certified Hearing Screeners. <u>VOLUNTEERS</u> are needed to help keep the process moving.
