My Sisters Closet—YWCA 2025 Summer Donations



DKA's Men's Community Clothing Closet assist any male person 18 years of age or older living in Pima County or adjacent areas to get free clothing. DKA trys to provide men with a more professional wardrobe, & are only accepting clothing that is free of stains and tears. They ask for closed-toe shoes only (no flip flops) and no graphic tees. They accept plain tshirts, polo shirts, button-ups, ties, belts, bags, coats, suits, pants, jeans and shorts that can be worn to work, hats, socks (gently used or new), and underwear (new only please!). DKA stock is entirely dependent on community donations and is free to those in need.

Your Sister's Closet is a YWCA Southern Arizona program that provides professional & business casual clothing to all women, with a focus on those who are unemployed and seeking work or newly employed & in need of appropriate attire, completely free of charge.
